Farsad Labbauf is an Iranian visual artist living and working in the New York area. Best known for his linear figurative paintings, he immigrated to the United States at the age of thirteen. After enrolling in Rhode Island School of Design in 1982, Labbauf received his Bachelor of Fine Arts, followed by a second degree in Industrial Design. His linear figurative paintings are inspired in part by studies in Quantum physics and reverence for such ideas as Unity and Monism. The origins of Labbauf's work lie in Figurative Expressionism, a style he practiced for more than two decades, leading to the creation of his linear figurative painting style. His paintings have been featured in more than sixty group shows across the globe, including Saatchi Gallery in London and Ex Aurum Museum in Pescara, Italy, in addition to solo exhibitions in New York, Boston, Amsterdam, Tehran, and Esfahan Museum of Contemporary Art. Labbauf's work can be found in numerous public and private collections including The Salsali Museum, Dubai, Saatchi Gallery in London, Carsten de Boer Art Collection, Amsterdam, Museum of Contemporary Art in Esfahan and The Newark Museum of Art in US. His work is currently represented by Etemad Gallery in Iran as well as Blank Space Gallery & Roya Khadjavi Projects in New York.









ROYA KHADJAVI



Azita Moradkhani was born in Tehran where she was exposed to Persian art, as well as Iranian politics, and that double exposure increased her sensitivity to the dynamics of vulnerability and violence that she now explores in her artmaking. She received her BFA from Tehran University of Art (2009), and both her MA in Art Education (2013) and her MFA in drawing, painting & sculpture (2015) from Boston's School of the Museum of Fine Arts & Tufts University. She was a recipient of both the Young Masters Art Prize and the Young Masters Emerging Woman Art Prize in London in 2017. She received the Saint Botolph Club Foundation Emerging Artists Grant that same year as well as the NYFA City Artist Corps Grants in 2021. The Financial Times (London) reviewed her series of drawings "Victorious Secrets" and the Boston Globe (MA) published reviews of her collaborative performance piece "Irezumi," and her curated exhibition "Echo" over the past few years. Her work has been exhibited nationally and internationally many times, including at the Royal Academy of Arts (London, UK), Newport Art Museum (RI, USA), and the Museum of Contemporary Art (Yinchuan, China). She has also been a visiting artist/lecturer at universities such as Davidson College (NC), Lesley University (MA), and the Parsons School of Design (NY), as well as a panelist at Harvard University, Southern New Hampshire University, and MIT. She has been granted numerous residencies, including Yaddo, Virginia Center for the Creative Arts (VCCA), McColl Center For Art + Innovation, the Massachusetts Museum of Contemporary Art (MASS MoCA), Silver Art Projects, and LMCC.



Nicky Nodjoumi Brooklyn-based artist Nicky Nodjoumi was born in Kermanshah, Iran in 1942. Earning a bachelor's degree in art from Tehran University of Fine Arts before relocating to the United States in the late 1960s.

Nodjoumi received his master's degree in Fine Arts from The City College of New York in 1974. Returning to Tehran to join the faculty of his alma mater, Nodjoumi joined his politically galvanized students in their criticism of the Shah's regime, designing political posters inspired by the revolutionary spirit sweeping the country, only to be exiled once more in the aftermath of the revolution.

This political engagement has continued to the present day. His nuanced gurative paintings engage in political discourse with a light, satirical touch, layering his personal heritage and lived experiences in Iran and the United States into scenes that resonate beyond specific historical contexts or geographical boundaries. Nodjoumi's works are conceived of as theatrical stages, where compositions of figures both serious and ridiculous, in the words of Phong Bui, "house meanings without irony, narratives without stories, humor without morality, above all creating a space that heightens the awareness of old and new history." Serious in subject matter and witty in execution, these rich and diverse characters enliven Nodjoumi's narratives and allude to collective experiences underpinned by socio- political struggles, articulating the full spectrum of feelings from aggression to victimhood.

Nodjoumi, an artist in his 80s, is one of the most significant artists of his generation, and his life and work will be the subject of a major upcoming HBO film. His works have been acquired by prominent museum collections worldwide, including: the Metropolitan Museum of Art, the British Museum, LACMA, the Guggenheim Abu Dhabi, and the Nelson-Atkins Museum, among others. In 2014, Nicky had a solo exhibition at the Cleveland Institute of Art titled 'The Accident,' and in 2019 a solo exhibition at the Kansas City Art Institute, titled 'The Long Day.' His exhibitions have been reviewed extensively, including in The York Times (in 2013 and again in 2020), The New Yorker, The Boston

<u>Review</u>, and <u>The Brooklyn Rail</u>, among many others. Excitingly, one of Nicky's work was highlighted in The New York Times as one of "The 25 Most Influential Works of American Protest Art Since World War II".



Ala Dehghan received her MFA in Painting & Printmaking from Yale University; MA and BFA in Persian Miniature Painting from Tehran University and Alzahra University in Tehran. She has presented solo and collective work at the Queens Museum, The Kitchen, Leslie Lohman Museum, the Asian/Pacific/American Institute at NYU, James Fuentes Gallery, Kai Matsumiya Gallery, Thomas Erben Gallery, Alyssa Davis Gallery, Stellar Projects NY, and Sargent's Daughters in New York; Vox Populi in Philadelphia; The Delfina Foundation in London; Thaddaeus Ropac Gallery in Paris; and Isfahan Museum of Contemporary Art, Iran, among others. She founded 17 Essex Gallery at the same address on the Lower East Side (2016-2021).

Ala Dehghan's artworks live outside the reach of habitual recognition. Their images arrive through a dream-like state—accessed both through the realm of sleep and in the spontaneous flow of painting. Dehghan references these experiences in an atmospheric sense, relaying dream logics and emotional terrains that in her works come to create a world of their own. Dehghan's early training in medieval Persian miniature painting and illuminated manuscripts remain at the heart of her art making, as do her ongoing personal study of esoteric knowledges, the literature of premodern spiritual psychology known as mythology, and the long history of Iranian folklore. The works in Holy Rotation deliver autonomous worlds within worlds: a constellation of between-spaces that knows dreaming to be a real dimension and likewise wonders at the illusions of reality; producing a mirror of painting as a pure metaphor for dreaming, and dreaming as a pure metaphor for painting.

Dehghan once described "painting" as a "pain-thing." For her, most of all, painting is a healing act. Principles of light and color are channels for connecting mind with matter with spirit. Throughout her work, love is an act that emerges from the divine, springing from that same place as grief, sharing the same quality as light does dark. Just as the sun gives its light to the moon and gives the moon her shadow, the moon receives and absorbs this light, carrying it through the night. In this flow she seeks out each individual

detail, bonded to deeply unconscious and emotional senses, tending to them as they perfectly reveal themselves. Luminous picture frames adorn and protect every image, embraced by golden murals that treat the architectural presence of the wall as the paper of a book. Both reference the method of tashir, in which the margins of pages become their own theater of figures, trees, animals, and other forces of nature and magic. Through all these evolutions, Holy Rotation delivers a return to self, an eternal formation.
